### AUTOMATED GATES ARRIVE ON FASTCAT ROUTE

Foot passengers travelling on our Portsmouth Harbour and Ryde Pier Head FastCat route began using newly installed automatic entrance gates at both ports in May.

The gates are able to recognise rail tickets with barcodes or QR codes as well as Wightlink paper tickets, passes and online tickets on smartphones. Port staff will be on hand for customers using rail tickets with magnetic strips, as these will require manual scanning as well as adults travelling with children.

Following a half a million pounds investment in the technology, the gates are designed to make foot passenger journeys easier and provide a direct link to rail ticketing systems. Once customers have passed through the electronic gates, they will be able to relax in the passenger lounge until their FastCat is ready for boarding.

# Hidden histories

Ahead of Heritage Open Days at the beginning of September, we've decided to take a peek behind the scenes and over the garden walls of some of the Island's historic houses and attractions, revealing their hidden stories and bringing their forgotten pasts back to life.

#### HIDDEN HISTORIES

### OSBORNE

Set amongst the wide fields and leafy woodlands above East Cowes is Osborne – an impressive Italianate villa, best known as Queen Victoria's former seaside home. With elegant terraces, an underground ice house and a walled garden growing everything from rhubarb to bergamot (that's the citrus fruit used in Earl Grey tea), it's a must-see for many Isle of Wight visitors. However, while its royal connections and Indian influences are well-known, Osborne has a wealth of other stories to uncover too.

Tucked away in the Swiss Cottage Museum are two elaborately embroidered Turkish-style jackets, once owned by two young brothers named Johans and Georgio. Rescued from the Bulgarian-Romanian border during the Crimean War, the badly injured pair were picked up by sailors from HMS Firebrand who brought them back to Britain. Once Queen Victoria heard their story, she took them under her wing, lodging them with Mrs Jackman – a tenant of the Osborne Estate living at Barton Cottages. Here they would grow up under the new names of John and George Hyde, with frequent visits from the Queen who would even drop by to sketch them.

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CARISBROOKE CASTLE

Occupying a prominent hilltop position, close to the centre of the Island is Carisbrooke Castle, whose crumbly stone walls have long been a feature of the local landscape, resisting centuries of weather and even a short-lived French siege. While you might like to clamber up to the Norman keep or watch the resident grey donkeys turn the historic well-house wheel – there's one particular character from Carisbrooke's past who deserves another look.

Jane Whorwood was a female secret agent and Royalist spy during the First Civil War. When King Charles I fled Hampton Court for the Isle of Wight in 1647, he soon found himself imprisoned behind the castle walls of Carisbrooke. Jane had already arrived in the nearby market town of Newport and as his 'escape manager' tried to coordinate his getaway. Coded letters were smuggled in and out, and she even arranged for a ship to whisk the king away to Holland once he'd broken free, however, unfortunately for Charles, none of his escape attempts ever proved successful.

### MOTTISTONE MANOR

On the southwestern side of the Island, in the shadow of Mottistone Down (and its mystical Neolithic standing stone), the winding road will lead you to the gates of Mottistone Manor. Mentioned in the Domesday Book, this ancient home (now owned by the National Trust) features a Tudor wing, an Elizabethan extension and some Sicilianinspired terraces and gardens laid out in the 1960s by Lady Vivien Nicholson.



Mottistone owner, Jack Seely was sent to the western front, accompanied by his horse, Warrior. They survived the battles of the First World War before returning to the manor.

After strolling through the orchards and visiting the tea garden for a reviving drink, you might like to crack out your compass and head for The Warrior Trail – a hiking route that gives a nod to a recently rediscovered local story. During the First World War, Mottistone owner General Jack Seely was sent to the Western Front, accompanied by his loyal, locally born and bred horse Warrior. Despite finding themselves in some of the fiercest battles of the conflict, Warrior survived and returned to the Island in 1918 as a local hero, living out the rest of his days in the fields around Mottistone.

Farringford is a Grade 1 Listed Building and was the main residence of the Poet Laureate Alfred, Lord Tennyson from 1853 until his death in 1892.

### FARRINGFORD

Not far from the lapping waves of Freshwater Bay is Farringford, a tranquil Gothic home once owned by the famous Victorian poet Alfred, Lord Tennyson. Here he would write poems (including Maud and Enoch Arden), take walks across the chalky downland wearing his black cape and broad-brimmed hat and occasionally escape from visitors through the turret staircase or across his specially made bridge which led out from his garden.

One guest he didn't try to avoid though was Queen Emma of Hawaii who visited the UK in 1865 to raise money to build a cathedral in Honolulu. An avid reader she was especially keen to meet Tennyson and was invited to spend a few days amongst the calming atmosphere of Farringford. During her time in Freshwater though, so many guests dropped by to catch a glimpse of the visiting Hawaiian queen that in the end Tennyson had to hide her in the summerhouse in the kitchen garden so she could read her letters in peace.

### MUSEUM OF ISLAND HISTORY

Amongst the busy streets of Newport, set in one of the oldest parts of town, is The Guildhall – an often overlooked building, characterised by its tall Greek columns and collonaded walkway below. Constructed in 1816, it was based on plans drawn up by high-flying architect John Nash – who also designed Brighton Pavilion, Marble Arch and Regent's Park in London. Initially intended as a marketplace with a town hall above, over the years this impressive stony-coloured building has undergone many tweaks and alterations and has previously housed Newport's ambulance station, fire station and courtroom too.



The Museum of Island History is housed in Newport's impressive Guildhall and the collection includes exhibits from the Isle of Wight's pre-historic past through to the present day.

Today, the ground floor is home to the Museum of Island History which last year opened its doors for free during Heritage Open Days. Alongside its permanent collections, it also hosted a special exhibition on the famous Isle of Wight Rodeo Riders – a group of local men who travelled the country performing incredible stunts on horseback between 1924 and 1939. Keep an eye out as they announce what's planned for this year's event.

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Adgestone Vineyard remains the oldest continuously operating vineyard in the UK. The Island's ample sunshine provides an ideal setting for grape cultivation, allowing the fruit to ripen slowly and develop complex flavours while retaining natural acidity. Furthermore, the Isle of Wight's chalky soils, reminiscent of those found in the Champagne region of France, impart minerality and depth to the wines that make each bottle truly unique. They are also the UK's only producers of sparkling blue wine, as seen on Channel 5's Isle of Wight Jewel of the South. The Vineyard serves as an excellent spot for those looking to learn more about the processes involved in producing English wine, from grape to glass, with audio-guided tours around the 10-acre site and wine-tasting lessons. There's also an onsite cafe and a shop stocked with local produce.

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# Stay by the sea

With the summer holidays upon us, there's no better place to be than by the sea. Whether you're looking for a coastal cottage, a clifftop campsite or a seaside holiday lodge just a short sprint down to those crisp blue waves, our handy guide has plenty of ideas.

### WHITECLIFF BAY

Arranged on a clifftop (sufficiently far back from the edge, of course) is Whitecliff Bay, a coastal holiday park offering everything from archery and crazy golf in the daytime to live acts and performances once the sun goes down. Depending on whether you book yourself into a lodge, caravan or chalet, you might get some shimmery sea glimpses from your accommodation windows.

> As the sun goes down, you can slide into your own hot tub at Whitecliff Bay. This coastal holiday park has facilities to keep the whole family happy.

For those who find the waters of the British seaside a bit on the chilly side there are places to stay with their own sufficiently steamy hot tubs too (try The Rockstar lodge for instance). Overlooked by the chalky cliffs of Culver, the shoreline is just a short shuffle down the hill and makes a great spot for the family to rub in that Factor 50 and soak up the seaside rays.

### THE BUDDLE SMUGGLERS INN

Supposedly one of the Island's oldest pubs (dating back to the 18th century), The Buddle Inn is filled to the rafters with character, charm and apparently the odd ghost too. Tucked down a quiet lane in the former smuggling village of Niton (once famous for its locally-caught crabs) it makes a superb seaside base for walks to St. Catherine's lofty lighthouse or the quaint bay at Castlehaven with its rustic beachfront cafés.

Back at the Buddle though, guests will find a range of recently revamped boutique rooms designed with comfort and style in mind. Here, menu options include the ribeye steak with duck fat potatoes, the burger with smoked cheese béchamel or The Buddle Fish Pie made up of smoked fish, tarragon, spinach and lemon sauce.

### THE ORCHARDS HOLIDAY PARK

Over in the West Wight hamlet of Newbridge, set amongst lush undulating countryside and with panoramic views over the ships in the Solent, you'll find The Orchards. Visitors to this award-winning holiday park can manoeuvre their campervans or hammer their tent pegs into one of the site's many grassy pitches. Alternatively, a fleet of bright and welcoming caravans awaits (each sleeping between four and six guests) – an option especially popular with the youngest visitors.

From The Orchards, a ten-minute drive to the west will bring you to the nautical harbour town of Yarmouth, where you can sample ice creams on the pier or cross over the river to explore the dunes of Sandhard Beach. Setting coordinates southwards instead will take you to the rugged coastline that flanks the Military Road, where the waves of The Channel are known to make excellent conditions for surfing.

Located in the upmarket sailing village of Seaview (from where it takes its name), you'll be close to sailing clubs, coastal walks and a selection of salt-kissed swimming beaches, including Seagrove Bay which has its own pop-up barista bar at this time of year.

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### VILLA AMANTI APARTMENT

Down on the Esplanade at Ventnor, amongst the brightly coloured deckchairs and circling seagulls, is Villa Amanti - an elegant sandy-coloured Victorian villa which wouldn't look out of place in Tuscany. Behind its row of welcoming palm trees, guests will discover a spick and span beachfront apartment, conveniently set on the building's ground floor.

Aside from the restful interiors and shipshape facilities, the pièce de résistance of this two-bedroom apartment has to be its compact front patio, which looks out across the shingly beach of Ventnor and onto the deep blue waters beyond. 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# A new home for bears

The Wildheart's Animal Sanctuary's latest rescue mission

Set against the backdrop of the alluring Sandown Bay, the Wildheart Animal Sanctuary has become well known for its inspiring rescue stories.

Just last year, they offered a forever home to two tigers, Softi and Toph, who had been found in the back of a horsebox on the Belarussian border, bound for fates unknown. Now, the Wildheart team has undertaken their biggest project yet: to build a brand-new habitat for two European Brown Bears and rescue them directly from Azerbaijan.

While many other rescued animals have been lucky to find temporary sanctuary in Europe before coming to the Wildheart Animal Sanctuary, bears Benji and Balu are still waiting to be saved from a concrete cage. The brothers have spent most of their lives at the side of a restaurant, living off scraps of food and serving as a novelty to attract customers. They have now been moved to a larger enclosure away from public view, but their living conditions are still less than favourable.



#### A NEW HOME FOR BEARS

That is why the Sanctuary has launched an urgent campaign to raise £150,000 for Benji and Balu's rescue, which will cover the necessary costs of transporting them across Europe and constructing a new purpose-built habitat. Since Project Bears launched in May, the Wildheart Animal Sanctuary has already raised over £45,000 through donations and has wasted no time in putting these funds to good use. Contractors have already begun works to transform a 3,500-metre square area into the perfect forever home for Benji and Balu.

Throughout the summer, there will be various fundraising events taking place on the Isle of Wight and beyond to raise money for this groundbreaking project. In June, the Wildheart team will be facing the Three Peaks Challenge, climbing three mountains in twenty-four hours, and on the 20 July you'll be able to 'bear' witness as two cyclists dressed as bears ride across the Island on Penny Farthing bikes – yes, you did read that right!

#### DAYS OUT: RAIN OR SHINE!

#### CANOPY SKATEPARK

If the forecast for the day ahead is a touch on the drizzly side, make your way to Canopy Skatepark, an all-weather skateboarding space set down a quiet lane, close to the South Wight hamlet of Chale Green. Housed in a former barn, it caters to every type of skater, from absolute beginners to seasoned, hardy professionals.

Before hitting those ramps though, check the schedule to find the best time to visit – whether you're looking for a girls-only skateboarding session or an instructor-led slot to perfect those ollies and kickflips. Located on a disused farm, the venture is part of a wider project to rejuvenate the site and offer a top-notch facility for visitors and locals alike. In the future, expect outdoor classrooms, nature trails, axe-throwing arenas and on-site accommodation too.

#### WIGHT KARTING

For those looking to rev things up a bit, Wight Karting on the outskirts of Ryde should easily satisfy your need for speed. The Island's only allweather outdoor karting track, anyone from the age of eight years and up can don a helmet and slide into a suit before taking to the 520-metre track to tackle those hairpin bends.

So far, almost 70,000 visitors have dropped by this familyowned attraction, with 34.098 seconds being the current fastest time to beat. Alongside the winding trackway, with its speedy petrol-powered go-karts whizzing by, you'll find a clubhouse with changing rooms, a licensed bar and food and drink available to pre-order if you feel like making a day of it.

#### ISLE OF WIGHT MOUNTAIN BIKE CENTRE

Meanwhile, over at the Isle of Wight Mountain Bike Centre, a spot of light rain certainly won't dampen the mood for those taking to the trails. Based on Cheverton Farm near Shorwell, the site features an array of purpose-built mountain biking routes, traversing dense woodlands and undulating open fields – originally built for the 2011 Island Games (an international sporting event for islands around the world).



The Isle of Wight Mountain Bike Centre has jump trails, flow trails and technical trails.

The action is better when it's wetter at Wight Karting!

Once in the saddle, the trails vary from blue (moderately intense) to black (pretty tricky) and include flow trails, jump trails and technical trails where you'll be navigating between tree stumps, roots and wooden roll-ins (which, if you don't know, are a type of ramp). From May to September, it's open every day of the week from 08:00– 20:00 and available for just £10 per person with a day pass.

For those looking for something a touch less muddy and bone-rattling, why not pick up a golf club and get putting at Lost World Adventure Golf – an Aztec-themed indoor crazy golf course, built atop the wooden planks of Sandown Pier.

# Discover an island of Mature, beauty and history

Enjoy family adventures in a hidden garden, a clifftop fort, the last windmill on the Island and a wildlife-filled nature reserve, as well as exploring over 5000 acres of countryside and golden, sandy beaches.

Moving from holes one to eleven, you'll encounter monkeys, lions, lightning and even smoke effects too as you meander through the recreated ruins, before tallying up those scores to find out who was the prime putter of the group. While it might only take half an hour to work your way round, it's open all day and ideal for dodging any short-lived downpours.

#### ISLE OF WIGHT AQUA PARK

Supposedly the Island's bounciest and wettest attraction, the Isle of Wight Aqua Park at Tapnell Farm is a suitably moist and slippery attraction for the damper days of the holiday. Competitors aged seven and over (and more than 110cm in height) can splash and slide their way around 20 different obstacles, including free-fall slides, bouncy staircases and inflatable runways.

Wetsuits and buoyancy aids are supplied on arrival, as well as changing rooms and a well-positioned spectators area for those who prefer to take it all in from the sidelines. After completing the course and working up an appetite, The Cow restaurant is conveniently close by, serving award-winning burgers and gently seared steaks.

#### ISLAND RIDING CENTRE

Finally, if you canter over to the green fields above Newport, you'll find the Island Riding Centre, an impressive equestrian complex including stables, livery yard and riding school – as well as an on-site bar and restaurant for those parents not keen to saddle up and brave the stirrups. With a surprisingly spacious indoor arena (bigger than an Olympic-sized swimming pool) the centre's horse-based activities make a fantastic option come rain or shine.



Island Riding Centre offer plenty of options for young riders including one-on-one lessons and a pony ride and pamper session – and the indoor arena is spacious and shower-proof!

Options for young visitors include one-to-one lessons, group lessons and a pony ride and pamper session (lasting 30 minutes and including a gentle introduction to riding). There's also a holiday club on offer, where young riders can take part in the day-to-day life of the stables, helping to make feeds, fill hay nets and muck out too.

We'd recommend starting with a pre-dinner drink at the world-famous, award-winning Spyglass Inn. Situated at the end of the Esplanade, right by the water's edge, this pub offers plenty of outdoor seating across its two terraces, where you can enjoy stunning views across the Channel whilst sipping on your favourite tipple. If you don't want your night to end there, they offer an extensive evening menu, with an emphasis on fresh seafood, alongside traditional pub classics.



The Smoking Lobster is known for serving local Island produce and seafood through a 'Pan-Asian lens' and holds two AA Rosettes.



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If you're searching for something a little lavish for dinner, look no further than the Smoking Lobster. This quirky little restaurant has earned itself two silver AA Rosettes since its opening in 2017, and is known for serving local Island produce and seafood through a 'Pan-Asian lens'. There's an assortment of Asian-inspired cocktails on offer to accompany your meal, as well as traditional quality Sake and a carefully curated wine list.

After dinner, make your way down to The Met, where there's an extensive selection of drinks to choose from, ranging from in-house speciality cocktails to fine wines. If you're not quite full, they also serve a range of small tapas plates.

Beer lovers are also in luck. The Ventnor Exchange is located in a former post office which now houses a studio theatre and a craft beer bar, with over 50 guest beers at any one time. Ventnor Exchange is also the HQ for the annual Ventnor Fringe Festival, held every summer. The Exchange hosts a bunch of shows, workshops and events year-round, so it's always worth checking out what's on (which can be done in advance on their website).

Ventnor really does have something for everyone, and whatever may be bringing you to the Isle of Wight this summer, a trip to this historic town should be at the top of your to-do list!

Using an e-cargo bike improves air quality, makes roads quieter and reduces traffic noise. It shows Islanders that bikes are an alternative to cars and inspires others towards a healthier lifestyle.

The e-cargo bikes can carry up to 150kg and surprising volumes of parcels. Keert riders receive a living wage and full training, with all deliveries insured and tracked – it's an efficient, safe, and secure service. For the past 18 months, Keert has been delivering for Isle of Wight businesses and local community groups, utilising volunteer assistance to ensure they can deliver all not for profit community deliveries. Keert now aims to expand all its services across more of the Island.

#### WATERSIDE COMMUNITY TRUST

Ryde's Waterside Community Trust has been awarded £7,500 towards the cost of an electric all-terrain vehicle. It will be used every day in the summer to respond to emergencies and transport beach wheelchairs, an inshore rescue boat and other kit between the beaches in Ryde and Sandown. Replacing a petrol vehicle, the e-ATV will eliminate fossil fuels and reduce carbon emissions and noise pollution.



The Waterside Community Trust deliver lifeguard and first aid training courses across the Island all year round.

The Trust encourages everyone to take part in its activities. They include a summer beach lifeguard service and a pioneering drowning prevention programme, as well as all-year-round training, delivering lifeguard and first aid courses across the Island and the South Coast. It also manages Waterside Pool, a 25-metre lido next to Ryde Beach.

This year the charity will be fitting PV solar panels to its pool and hall along with an efficient heat exchange unit, which will cut gas and electricity usage – and bills.

We look forward to following the progress of these projects and in a future issue we'll catch up with them both. In the meantime, stay tuned to our Wightlink in the Community social media channels: facebook.com/wightlinkinthecommunity or instagram.com/wightlinkcommunity

### cream

Nothing says British summertime like an ice cream by the sea – and thankfully the Isle of Wight has plenty of unusual creamy creations you'll want to stick a Flake in. From parlours packed with locally churned flavours, to vegan sorbet makers and artisanal ice cream vans, we pair our favourite coastal spots for a little 'beaches and cream', so let's get scooping!

#### TOPPINGS

On Shanklin Esplanade you'll find Toppings – an ice cream parlour so close to the beach you can almost taste the sea salt. Here, they offer over 50 tasty ice cream flavours (including gluten-free and vegan choices) where you could plump for blueberry, candy floss or maybe a caramel-infused millionaire's shortbread. If a few scoops in a wafer cornet just won't cut it, then try their spectacular sundaes, including ice cream scoops of your choice, a sprinkle of chopped nuts, a drizzle of fruit sauce and of course a Flake on top. With the sands of Shanklin Beach just across the road, you won't have far to go for a scenic spot to enjoy it.

#### CRAVE

There's always a raspberry ripple of excitement when Tracy and Chris from Ventnor's Crave announce their latest flavours on social media. With inventive options including white chocolate latte, rose and pistachio and nibbly chocolate fingers, it's no wonder they often have queues out the door.

Inside their distinctively curved home on Spring Hill, they also create special batches for those with dietary requirements – such as the vegan açaí berry sorbet or the zero sugar dark chocolate ice cream. Plus, to top things off, it's just a short downhill shuffle to the sparkly blue waves of The Channel – the perfect location to get tasting (if that is, your ice creams haven't already disappeared on the walk down).

#### SCOOPS OF YARMOUTH

Tucked down Yarmouth's Wheatsheaf Lane (and just a cone's throw from the boat-filled harbourside), you'll find Scoops. For the indecisive ones amongst us, they have a handy spin wheel outside the door, helping you choose which of their locally sourced options to try out – each one sourced from within a 10-mile radius of the shop.



Scoops of Yarmouth is just a cone's throw from our Yarmouth port and has over 30 flavours to choose from – as well as some just for dogs!

Options include Isle of Wight made mango sorbet or chocolate orange ice cream, as well as scoops of coffee mocha and crystallised ginger which come from just across the Solent. Special rotating guest flavours also make an appearance (which can be enjoyed on waffles or blended into milkshakes) and for the canine community, Scoops even offers flavoured doggie ice creams from nutrition-led brand Billy + Margot.

#### **BLISS ICE CREAM**

Also popping up around the Island's coastal towns and villages this summer is Bliss – a bright blue ice cream van run by Jenny and Louise, the women behind three of the Island's locally churned ice cream labels. Parking up in different spots, they'll be providing milkshakes, sundaes and ice cream topped waffles, as well as waffle cones and tubs of their ice creamy creations, all made with 100% Isle of Wight milk and cream.



Established in Ryde in 1950, Minghella have a rich heritage on the Isle of Wight, renowned for creating fabulous flavours such as old English toffee.

The distinctively curved frontage of The Ventnorian on Spring Hill in Ventnor is home to Crave.

#### PARADICE

Since 2018, number 56 on the High Street in Cowes has been home to Paradice, a shipshape ice cream parlour which can whizz up different combinations of their icey flavours into over three hundred types of milkshakes. Visitors peering through their freezer counter windows will see a tasteful selection of Gelarto and Kelly's Cornish Ice Cream – including chocolate and hazelnut, coconut and (local favourite) Sicilian pistachio. Also on the menu are knickerbocker glories, banana splits and affogatos – served with a splash of local espresso from Newport-based company Island Roasted. From the Paradice doorstep, just follow the winding curves of Bath Road round to Cowes Esplanade where you can hop onto the wall and tuck into that sundae whilst the boats glide in and out of the harbour.

#### MINGHELLA

Top of the list to try has to be the Minghella brand of ice creams, first established in Ryde in 1950 by Italian 'master gelatiere' Edward Minghella and his wife Gloria. At a time when ice cream was only ever eaten plain in Britain, the pair experimented with all sorts of flavours and soon won themselves a loyal following. Today the tradition continues and you can try their top-notch ice creams for yourself in flavours including old English toffee, crushed walnuts and maple syrup, lemon meringue and fudgey sundae.

The north of the Island is home to possibly the best-known town on the Isle of Wight, Cowes. Long associated with sailing and all things nautical, Cowes is a hive of activity during the summer months...

From the sailing competitions including the Round the Island Race and Cowes Week, to the dry land entertainment, there are a multitude of events taking place. Many of the pubs that line the High Street have live music playing and there are street entertainers – it's a real party atmosphere. A summer stroll from Cowes to the neighbouring village of Gurnard is a must, with perfect vantage points lining this flat and even walk. Upon arrival, you will find Gurnard to be a pretty little village with a couple of pubs, a post-office-come-coffee shop and a peppering of beach huts lining the esplanade.

Across the River Medina is East Cowes. Once the holiday destination of Queen Victoria and her family, a trip to the Island would not be complete without a tour around her palatial holiday home, Osborne. It was built between 1845 and 1851 in a quintessential Italian Renaissance palazzo style, with its sweeping terraces, towers and stunning formal gardens leading down to a beautiful beach, only accessible through the grounds.

The north east has everything going for it. From the miles of golden sands that hug the coastline, to the wildlife-rich limestone ledges off St Helens Duver and the hustle and bustle of the Island's largest town, Ryde...

Here you will find miles of perfect sandy beaches coupled with excellent entertainment. Stripey beach huts sit alongside coastal cafés and restaurants, whilst traditional funfairs, trampolines, a bowling alley and a boating lake provide hours of entertainment for all the family. The town itself is built up a hill that provides wonderful views when looking back down towards the Solent and the pre-Victorian pier. You will find a good range of boutique shops for that one-off treasure, as well as plenty of places to relax with a drink and a bite to eat.

Venturing out of Ryde you will undoubtedly stumble across Seaview. The picturesque Edwardian coastal town has a nostalgic charm, with regattas galore during the summer months and the sea is busy with Mermaid boats and kitesurfers. The beaches here are slightly quieter and have a distinctly desert island feel.

Round the corner, before you hit the most easterly tip of the Island you will pass through the village of St Helens, known for its large village green that forms the centre. On the outskirts towards Brading, Oasis is well worth a visit. Family owned and run, this shop is a veritable treasure trove, packed with interesting and unique items for the home – many hand-picked in Bali. They also have a coffee shop where the cakes are worth the visit alone!

The small parish of Fishbourne could be mistaken for not much more than a place to get on and off the Island at Wightlink's ferry port, but you would be missing a trick. It is the ideal place to start a walk to neighbouring Quarr Abbey along a well-trodden path. Quarr Abbey was built next to the ruins of the original abbey in 1911. There are beautiful grounds to explore, where you will find pigs to feed and watch as they revel in the mud. The Tea and Farm Shop does a superb ploughman's and stocks the Abbey's own produce, including the refreshing Quarr Abbey Ale.

Further inland, you can step into a perfectly preserved piece of history. The Isle of Wight Steam Railway provides a brilliant family day out. Take the steam train along the line from Wootton to Smallbrook Junction. Alight at Havenstreet for a trip around the award-winning Train Story Discovery Centre, watch engines being renovated or stretch your legs and venture through the Woodland Walk.

# South -

The southern point of the Island has its own distinct feel, due to the unique microclimate and the artistic heritage that is still in full swing today...

Ventnor is a real mini-Mediterranean town, bustling with pavement cafés, where people sit and take in the views of the English Channel. The town has a distinct artisan vibe, as zigzag roads with Victorian terraces lead down to one-off shops including art galleries, vintage and antique emporiums and jewellers. There are plenty of independent eateries that use local produce. Being close to the sea, seafood is, of course, a local speciality. Watch the fishermen sail in on their boats and then pick up the day's catch at the shop on the harbour. Try one of the pubs and restaurants that will be offering fresh fish as the daily special, such as The Spyglass Inn that sits atop the sea wall. The unique climate of the south is perhaps best experienced with a trip to Ventnor Botanic Garden, where you will find an unrivalled selection of subtropical and exotic plants and flowers set in 22 acres. From the garden, take a walk down to Steephill Cove where after the (many) steps, you will be rewarded with a picturesque cove and a smattering of eateries serving up the speciality of locally-caught crab.

A visit over this side provides the perfect excuse for a trip to the Isle of Wight Donkey Sanctuary where everyone is welcome, including well-behaved dogs. Rugged beaches, steep cliffs and beautiful walks, the south coast has it all and it's no wonder it has inspired a few famous names over the years, including Charles Dickens who wrote several chapters of David Copperfield here.

# West 🥂

The West Wight is a stunning part of the Island. Fields, forests and miles of coastline stretch out ahead of you as you go west...

Open space, unspoiled landscapes and rugged coastline, plus pretty towns and villages, lively pubs and independent shops make this a top destination. If you're arriving on the Wightlink ferry from Lymington, you will find yourself in the heart of Yarmouth. This historic harbour town contains some of the Island's oldest architecture, including English Heritage's 16th century Yarmouth Castle, the last addition to King Henry VIII's coastal defences.

The beauty of the west has inspired many artists over the years including Julia Margaret Cameron, the pioneering art photographer, and her neighbour Alfred, Lord Tennyson, Poet Laureate during Queen Victoria's reign. Take a walk from Freshwater Bay to the Tennyson monument and the panoramic views mean it's not hard to see why. The poet used to walk on the down almost every day, saying that the air was worth 'sixpence a pint'. No trip over to this side would be complete without a visit to the iconic landmark of The Needles. The three chalk stacks and the classic red and white striped lighthouse are synonymous with the Isle of Wight, adorning many a picture postcard. Take a chairlift ride down to Alum Bay, past the coloured sands.

The west side has more than its fair share of Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, with Newtown perhaps being the jewel in the crown. A village built on the site of a medieval borough and a nature reserve makes for a great day out. Spot red squirrels, egrets and even a resident seal as you take a stroll around the estuary.

Brighstone is a pretty and busy village, nestled between the chalk downland to the north and stretching to the south-west facing coast. Famous for numerous dinosaur finds in the eroding cliffs, stop off along the way at Isle of Wight Pearl in Brighstone for some of the most impressive views of the English Channel and a beautiful shop dedicated to pearls, catering for all styles and tastes, plus The Pearl Café is open daily.

### Best beach for watersports: COMPTON BAY

Well known for its waves when they are big, Compton is great for surfing and when they are small, even better for bodyboarding and just general fun in the water. Swim round to the secret coves that can't be accessed by foot. Do let someone know if you are going swimming as this beach does not have a lifeguard but does have an independent lifeboat station.

### Best beach for sunsets: COLWELL

They say west is best and that is certainly the case when it comes to sunsets. The beach at Colwell provides a stunning display with Hurst Castle creating a dramatic silhouette across the Solent. Take a dip in the sea here for an evening swim followed by a drink at one of the few pubs and eateries nearby.

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At the heart of the Island you will find several quaint villages, as well as the Island's capital town, Newport. Here you will enjoy a mixture of High Street names and some excellent independent boutiques for both fashion and homewares...

The town centres around two main squares then stretches down to the historic quay where you will find an art gallery and café. The Bargeman's Rest pub sits on the water's edge and is an ideal spot to relax.

For local heritage, Carisbrooke Castle is hard to beat. The history of the castle can be traced back to about AD 1000. Raided by both the Spanish and French, the castle's most famous inhabitant was King Charles I, who was imprisoned here during the Civil War between 1647–1648, before being executed in 1649.

Take a drive through Arreton and be sure to stop off at Arreton Barns, the Island's largest centre for arts and crafts. Here you will find traditional crafters mixed with contemporary artisans.
