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
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Welcome to autumn on the Isle of Wight

We work hard to ensure that every sailing operates as planned and on time. This year so far^{*}, we have achieved 94.2% punctuality and 99.5% reliability, and we are constantly improving on this. When a sailing is disrupted by 30 minutes or more, we will let you know via the Wightlink App or by email.

PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT

Everyone at Wightlink is eager to reduce our impact on the environment. I will be driving Wightlink forward to meet future sustainability challenges head-on, including our commitment to decarbonising our ships and shore facilities.

SUPPORTING ISLAND COMMUNITIES

This year we welcomed several new teams and groups to our Wightlink in the Community sponsorship scheme. 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

FAMILY-FRIENDLY FRIGHTS

Shanklin Chine is transforming into a haven for the haunted during their Halloween Spooktacular on 4 October–2 November! Take in the beauty of the Island's oldest tourist attraction by day with all of its autumnal colours, but be sure to stick around until the sun sets, because that's when the real magic happens. Visitors can explore the Chine's many winding, illuminated paths while keeping their eyes peeled for creepy creatures and critters scattered around the site. Be prepared to come face to face with anything from werewolves to wyverns. There'll also be live music during the weekends, where you can expect to hear an assortment of your favourite monstrous melodies. Fancy dress is strongly encouraged!



Tapnell Farm's Pumpkin Festival is a seasonal favourite that offers a delightful blend of activities for the entire family. Held between 28–31 October, the festival sees the farm transform into a sea of orange with pumpkins of all shapes and sizes to choose from. 
What will you find lurking in the undergrowth at Shanklin Chine this Halloween

Families can enjoy themed crafts, with a make-your-own spooky pizza and pumpkin carving workshop, and take part in a scarecrow treasure trail hunt, with prizes for those who figure out what they're trying to spell. There'll also be a spine-chilling slime party!

Experienced storytellers lead you through darkened corridors and rooms, recounting chilling tales of ghostly apparitions and unexplained phenomena. The castle's past comes alive with these spine-tingling stories, making it a must-visit for those who love a good scare. 

For those in search of an authentic paranormal experience, join Marc Tuckey on an Isle of Wight Ghost Experience. A seasoned ghost hunter for 30 years, Marc leads tours of some of the Island's most famously haunted locations throughout October. Tours include visits to eerie sites like Arreton Barns, the ghostly Knighton Gorges and Ventnor Botanic Garden – which was once the site of the Royal National Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.

During the tours, Marc shares his extensive knowledge of the Island's haunted history and recounts personal experiences with the supernatural. Attendees have reported seeing phantom carriages, spectral figures and unexplained

Shipwrecks, shouts and safety 200 Years of the RNLI

Since 1824, the RNLI's brave band of nautical volunteers have been taking to the waves to save lives at sea – including from the sparkly seas of the Isle of Wight. And as if one momentous anniversary wasn't enough, the Yarmouth station is celebrating its 100th birthday too. So, don a life jacket and prepare your best set of sea legs as we dive in to find out more. Back in the early days of the 19th century, around 1,800 ships a year were wrecked around Britain's coastline, from the chilly waters of the Shetlands to the rocky coast of Cornwall and even along the Isle of Wight's notoriously treacherous southern shore. With major loss of life and no rescue organisations in place to help, something had to be done, and philanthropist Sir William Hillary was the man to do it.



The RNLI has saved over 146,000 lives since inception in 1824.

From the grand interior of the City of London Tavern (one of the capital's most fashionable meeting places and a popular haunt of Charles Dickens) Sir William formed a charitable group devoted to rescuing men and women in trouble at sea. Starting with thirty supporters, and soon joined by King George IV, it later took on the name of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI) and has since saved over 146,000 lives.

With the Solent on one side and the Channel on the other, the waters around the Isle of Wight have certainly kept the RNLI busy over the years – including the crew of the Yarmouth Lifeboat Station who first opened their boathouse doors in 1924. These shipshape volunteers have been involved in plenty of extraordinary rescues in their time, including a Greek steamship carrying tangerines from Algiers which struck rocks off the Needles and sank in 1947. Just in the past 54 years alone, the Yarmouth RNLI have launched their lifeboat, most recently the Severn Class All-weather Lifeboat (ALB), over 2,000 times and saved an impressive total of 777 lives in that period, winning seventeen awards for their courage and bravery in the process.

REAL PUBS GREAT LOCATIONS

THE BARGEMAN'S REST

Fortunately, two hundred years on from launch, few ships are wrecked around the coast of the UK, but the RNLI's mission of saving lives at sea is just as relevant today. If you're wondering what the RNLI looks like in action, then last summer's dramatic search and rescue operation for two missing paddleboarders off the Dorset coast serves as the perfect example. Within sixteen minutes of the 'shout' going out, the volunteer crew at Yarmouth had already assembled at the station, pulled on their kit, boarded the lifeboat and set sail to join the search. Earlier that afternoon, RNLI lifeboats from Swanage, Poole, Mudeford and Lymington had been scanning the seas for the missing paddleboarders, alongside police and HM coastguard helicopters – but as yet, no one had been found.

With three crew members up top, acting as lookouts, and four below working on search patterns, the Yarmouth crew started their task and within five minutes of searching, they found something. "Tom was looking

through the binoculars" remembers RNLI Senior Station Technician Richard Pimm, "and as we got closer, he said: 'It's a paddleboarder!'. We instantly thought: 'Oh my god, we've found them!' it was an amazing feeling, but then the realisation set in that it was only one paddleboarder when two had been reported missing".

Discovered four miles from the Swanage coast, and having spent seven hours floating out at sea, the paddleboarder was exhausted and confused. Thankfully, the skilled Yarmouth crew managed to get him aboard and keep him warm until a helicopter came to winch him away and quickly transfer him to hospital. Soon word reached the crew that the other paddleboarder had safely made it to shore at Bournemouth and they could all breathe a sigh of relief after a job well done. "It was like looking for a needle in a haystack and then actually finding that needle" explains volunteer crew member Peter Lemonius, "we were elated, it's a fantastic feeling. Without the RNLI, there's no shadow of a doubt, that guy would have died out there that night".

Staying safe at sea

While we can all agree that the RNLI's heroic crews and their skilful seamanship are handy to have on standby, it's better if we can avoid the need for a 'shout' in the first place by swotting up on our water safety and taking the utmost care when in or on the water. With that in mind, here are some simple rules to remember if you're thinking of paddleboarding off the Isle of Wight coastline.

- Wear a buoyancy aid and suitable clothing The lifejacket will help keep you afloat, while a wetsuit will keep you warm and stop you from catching a chill.
- Carry your phone in a waterproof pouch Hung around your neck and safe from water damage, you'll be able to call 999 or 112 and ask for the coastguard if you find yourself in trouble.
- Wear the correct leash

If you lose your balance and end up falling in the water, an appropriate leash will ensure you and your board stay connected.

• Avoid offshore winds

Turn back to shore as soon as you encounter any gusty winds or strengthening breezes, especially if they are offshore, as they can carry you far out to sea, making it tricky and tiring to head back to land.

Autumn escapes and winter breaks

When the buckets and spades have been packed away and the nights are drawing in and getting chilly, there's nothing better than planning a getaway. The Island has everything you need for an autumn or winter break, from bracing walks on the beach to watching the leaves change colour in acres of forest, and for those who don't fancy the great outdoors, some places to pamper yourself. Stay in a little piece of history at Farringford, once home to the poet Alfred, Lord Tennyson in the 1800s, in one of their delightful holiday cottages. Located in a peaceful courtyard to the rear of the main house, there are two cottages to choose from with a further five stable cottages at the edge of the estate, some of which are dog-friendly, so ideal if Fido fancies a trip to the Island. Both Alfred cottages have woodburning stoves, perfect for a getaway in chillier weather or to warm up after you've stomped up Tennyson Down, named after the great man himself.

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

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

Island born, Sophie is the owner and head jeweller at Honeybourne Jewellery in Ventnor. In 2003, she started the business after graduating with an MA from the Royal College of Art and training under Chris Morphy from Theodosia for seven years. Working alongside husband Raff and jeweller Emily, the trio work in silver, gold, enamels, precious and semi-precious stones to create beautiful jewellery and bespoke pieces.

"It's the pace of life that the Island offers that makes it a unique place to live and work. During the summer months, I venture down to Ventnor Beach for an early morning swim before opening up the shop. As I dust off the sand from my toes, I always feel incredibly lucky to be able do this. Living in St Lawrence, my morning commute takes minutes and the freedom to sea swim before work never tires.

I love camping at Compton Farm, having a fire and watching the sunset through the valley over Freshwater Bay and Tennyson Down. The stars out that way at night are amazing.

I'd have to say my favourite beach has got to be Ventnor, for many reasons year-round. It's great for daily winter walks with our little whippet Syd and during the summer, it's perfect for family fun, swimming, snorkelling and paddle-boarding as well as relaxing with friends with fish and chips and a pint. It's a safe beach for our son Rex to meet friends and explore, plus it's great for food and drinks, it's got everything you need.

The stunning rugged coastline from Ventnor to Niton via St Lawrence is the best place for a walk in my opinion. The landscape changes with the seasons, but it's beautiful whatever the weather.

Although the Island has a wealth of amazing events, without a doubt, the Ventnor Fringe Festival is my favourite. To see this independent festival grow into the spectacle that it is today has been a real joy. It brings a whole new audience to Ventnor and with it, a real party vibe to our doorstep for the 10-day duration, it's not to be missed.

If I only had an hour on the Island, I'd probably head down to The True Food Kitchen in Niton for lunch during the summer months but would try to fit in a little walk to St Catherine's lighthouse or a quick swim, breathtaking scenery and excellent food!

Goddards Brewery is a must-visit for any beer enthusiast and is the oldest brewery on the Island. In their purposebuilt visitor facility, you can sample a range of their awardwinning beers and ales at the Firkin' Deck Restaurant and Bar, all of which are brewed onsite just metres away from your seat. You may even catch the team at work from the restaurant's observation deck during your visit.

The Pilot Boat Inn on the other hand is one of the latest additions to the craft beer scene. Owned by the Wight Knuckle Brewery, this quirky boat-shaped little pub on the corner in Bembridge acts as the taproom for the brewery, where you can try all of their core range and seasonal beers, as well as grab a pizza or a bite to eat. The inn also offers themed nights and has accommodation available with five en suite rooms.

For the true connoisseurs, a trip to Newport Ale House is a must-visit. This friendly, independent free house is the smallest on the Isle of Wight. 

Inspirational Islanders: Andrew Dowden Ceramics and mixed media artist

An Islander for over 30 years, Andrew now wouldn't choose any other place to live. The continually changing landscapes and seascapes inspire his distinctive handmade ceramics and artwork. He became an artist whilst researching a book on Isle of Wight Pottery, 'A Century of Ceramics', after watching a pot being thrown on a wheel. He has co-organised several successful historical Isle of Wight pottery exhibitions and exhibited across the Island.

"Everyone says this I know, but the Island is such a special place to live; and has been a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve since 2019. As Islanders we are most fortunate to benefit from so many dramatic landscapes and seascapes; I love the winter months, but even during the summer there is always a quiet place you can escape to.

My favourite place has to be Quarr Abbey. As soon as you turn off the main road, down the tree-lined drive, a calm descends. The landscaped grounds are green and leafy, and the magnificent brick church, with its unique architecture, is visible from almost every spot. There's a farm shop, a great tearoom and, of course, there is the art gallery which has a changing exhibition every week.

There are so many beaches around the Island, each one having its own special or unique feature – but my favourite is at Osborne House, followed by Brighstone beach. Both have inspired my artwork. Osborne beach is mainly sandy and surrounded by trees. The seaside café serves great coffee and scones; and it's a great place to sit in a deckchair and relax. Brighstone beach is sandy with high cliffs, and my wife and I love walking there at sunset.

There are so many great walks on the Island! A few favourites: Being an English Heritage member, walking around the grounds at Osborne House at any time of year is good for my health and well-being, and it's always inspirational for my artwork. The gentle hike up to Shanklin and St Martin's Downs is another good one, and worth it for the views at the top across to Tennyson Down in one direction, and the open sea in the other.

The Island has such a creative community: musicians, artists, festivals, exhibitions, shows, theatre, but my favourite event is the annual Wolverton Manor Garden Fair. Set in the glorious Shorwell countryside, with the Elizabethan manor presiding, there's always plenty going on, with over 150 plant and craft stalls, displays, music and activities.

If I only had an hour on the Island I would have to visit Quarr Abbey. The grounds are lovely, the atmosphere is peaceful and relaxing, there's lots to see – including the Quarr pigs – and learn about the Abbey and its fascinating history, walks and wildlife – and the coffee is great!"

Green news: sustainability update

Even though our hybrid flagship Victoria of Wight came into service 6 years ago, sustainability is still our priority. She has been a fantastic addition to our fleet, but there is much more to do.

Powered by hybrid energy, from a combination of batteries and conventional engines, she sails round the clock, using 20 per cent less fuel and producing 17 per cent fewer carbon emissions than ships of a similar size.

> Victoria of Wight can carry up to 178 cars and more than 1,000 passengers on every crossing between Portsmouth and Fishbourne, Isle of Wight.

We plan to switch to all-electric ferries once the right power sources are available at our ports. Cutting emissions is essential to making our ferry services more environmentally friendly.

Most recently we installed solar panels at our ports in Gunwharf Road Portsmouth, Lymington and Fishbourne. We are also looking at installing solar panels on our ferries.

In the first six months of 2024, 52,085kW of power was generated by our solar panels, enough to boil 473,501 litres of water for 1,894,004 cups of tea or coffee (*based on a 250ml serving). We are actively increasing our recycling rates and we've installed a new waste compactor at our Portsmouth Gunwharf port. Not only does this decrease the volume of our waste, it makes it easier to manage and reduces the number of trips needed to transport the waste to a landfill or recycling centre, saving fuel.

In our food outlets we prioritise products that are grown, harvested, or produced close to home. By doing so, we minimise food miles – the distance food travels from farm to table – ensuring that our food is fresher and more ecofriendly. This is why you'll find milk from Briddlesford Farm Dairy in our Island Roasted coffees and sandwiches from Grace's Bakery.

As part of our Green Solent Project, we work with severa environmental organisations. Blue Marine Foundation maintains thriving oyster nurseries at our Lymington port and the University of Portsmouth marine scientists have placed cuttlefish habitats under Ryde Pier and at Portsmouth Harbour to gain new insights into the lives of the marine molluscs.



Wightlife

We work with Forestry England and the Roy Dennis Wildlife Foundation to transport young white-tailed eagles from Scotland for release on the Isle of Wight.

We help white-tailed eagles, oysters, cuttlefish and wildlife reserves thrive through our partnerships.



We work closely with marine scientists from the University of Portsmouth to deliver outreach activities to Isle of Wight primary schools.

We're also a partner of Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust, supporting its reserves team to cross the Solent and to rewild the Island's natural environment.

We host marine scientists from the University of Portsmouth onboard and at our ports to deliver outreach activities including for children from Isle of Wight primary schools. We also work with the Solent Seascape Project, working to restore, protect and connect nature within the Solent. This is the first seascape-scale marine restoration project in the UK.


> The Solent Seascape Projectis an official United Nations Decade Action that contributes towards international goals for the protection and restoration of marine biodiversity.

It is unique as it recognises the critical role of connectivity across key habitats – salt marshes, seagrass beds, oyster reefs and seabird sites – due to the collective benefits they provide for people and nature.


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CENTRAL

At the heart, is the county town of Newport. A traditional market town centred around two squares with St Thomas' Church at the centre. Also known as the Minster, it is the final resting place of Princess Elizabeth, daughter of King Charles I. Within the church, a monument to the princess, commissioned by Queen Victoria, is carved in white marble

Carisbrooke, on the outskirts of Newport, is famed for its castle which was most notably the prison of King Charles I during the Civil War.

For a local shopping experience, nestled within the rolling fields of the village of Arreton is Arreton Barns. The Island's largest arts and crafts centre showcases the best in local artisans, artists and craftspeople – from glass blowing and ceramics to leather work and paintings. "I think it is the prettiest place I ever saw in my life."



A short drive from Newport and you'll think you've stepped into the cover of a chocolate box. 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

Isle of Wight Studio Glass has remained internationally pre-eminent in studio glass design and production for over half a century. Today, from the studio at Arreton Barns, master glassmaker Timothy Harris continues the family tradition. Attracted at an early age by the heat, fire and smoke of his father's studio, as soon as he could hold a blowing iron Timothy began to experiment for himself. Inspired by the Island's breathtaking scenery, flora, fauna and magical coastlines, he still finds new ways of working with hot glass – constantly experimenting in his quest for perfection.

"My first experience of the Island was as a young teenager when in 1972 I moved over with my younger brother and parents. The Island has offered me a very safe, friendly, happy environment full of inspiration to grow into and work, and it continues to do so for our ever-growing family.

My favourite place has got to be the Undercliff, which has influenced me in my work as a glass designer and maker giving me much pleasure and enjoyment, as it still does. Running along the southern coast from Niton to Bonchurch, it's a great place for a walk and you can feel like you're stepping back in time in parts.

The Isle of Wight has some beautiful beaches, but Binnel Bay (also in the Undercliff) was always a place to seek inspiration for my work and solitude. It's a hidden gem, rugged and unspoilt. My children enjoyed many a time amongst the rock pools when they were smaller.

Cuisine-wise the Island has a very diverse choice of eating and drinking establishments most of which are a delight to explore and enjoy. I'm not sure I could narrow it down to just one favourite. One of my great distractions is the Isle of Wight Scooter Rally which takes place each year over the August bank holiday weekend. With over 5,000 riders, it is the largest gathering of scooters in the world. Celebrating all things scooter-related and iconic British cultures – it's like a carnival on two wheels!

It might sound predictable, but if I only had one hour on the Island, my first choice would always be to go to my studio and make a piece of glass."
